



Psalm 34 “A Recipe for Enjoyment”

Discussion Questions

INTRODUCTION

Psalm 34 is iconic for calling readers to ‘taste and see that the Lord is good.’ On Sunday, Drew challenged to praise God for his goodness and to experience his goodness firsthand.

DISCUSSION & APPLICATION

1. What is the difference between objectively knowing about God’s love and tasting and seeing God’s love for yourself? Why is this difference important? When and how have you experienced God’s love?
2. If the culmination of a beautiful experience is sharing it with others, then what prevents us from sharing the goodness of God? If you have experienced, first hand, the love of God, why might it be difficult to share that with others in word and deed?
3. What is it that generates praise in you? What lifts your soul?
4. Read verses 8-10. What does David mean when he says you ‘lack no good thing?’ If you ‘lack no good thing,’ why don’t you always have the things you need/want? How do we know that we can trust God’s promises to care for and rescue us?
5. Why do you come to church on Sundays? Why is gathering with the church important?
6. What is your cave of sin? Why do you retreat there rather than living in the will of God?

PRAYER

Spend some time in prayer with one another for things drawn out of the discussion. If anyone has needs, pray that God would answer those requests.
