Discussion Questions

INTRODUCTION

Idolatry is setting your heart on anything other than God. The reality is that our hearts are idol factories. The church at Corinth has a major problem with idolatry which has created tension among believers. Instead of relying on Christ, they have been relying on piety and tradition. In 1 Corinthians 10, Paul challenges followers of Christ to flee from sin, to lay down their idols, and to make much of Christ to His glory.

DISCUSSION & APPLICATION

1. What is the glory of God? Why is it important to make the glory of God central to the Christian life? What are some ways that we might glorify God?
2. How can the sin of our past encourage us to live our lives for God’s glory, now and forever? How can you flee from sin? How has Christ allowed you to overcome temptation? How does perseverance over sin build up our faith?
3. Why are religious traditions, spiritual presumptions, and family heritage unable to keep us from sin and secure our eternal faith?
4. What is idolatry? What idols are you struggling with? Why is encountering Jesus the only sufficient way to deliver us from idols?
5. What is true repentance? How might we flee from sin and feast on Jesus?
6. How can we leverage our freedoms on the mission of God to the glory of God? What does someone that imitates Christ look like? Who is imitating Christ in you? How has this shaped your view of 1 Corinthians 10:31?

Pray for opportunities to feast on Christ and live a life worthy of the glory of God.
